### **Program Details:**

- 5 year apprenticeship
  - 1400 classroom hours; 280 hrs. Per- year, taught by UA trained Journeyman instructors
  - 7500 in-field working hours; shadowing trained and seasoned journeyman, 1500 per year
- United Association (UA) membership
- Local Union membership
- Health & Welfare Benefits
- Pension & Retirement
- Begin at 40% of Journeyman wage (currently \$32.82) current starting rate \$13.13
- 6 month advancements in status and pay rate
  - must meet all requirements to receive advancements

### **Needed To Apply:**

- High School diploma or GED Certificate
- High School or GED grades transcripts
- Valid birth certificate
- Must have valid driver's license
- Must be at least 18 years of age and graduate from high school/GED no later than July 1 of the current application year
- Must live within Local#42 work jurisdiction (Ashland, Crawford, Erie, Huron, Knox, Lorain, Morrow, Richland and Wyandot counties)
- Must be willing to submit to a background check
- Current application fee of \$35.00

### **Application Process:**

- Differential Aptitude Test (DAT) in the areas of Mechanical Aptitude, Numerical Reasoning, Abstract Reasoning, and Spatial Relations. You can find information at your local library or on the internet.
- Up to 2 personal interviews with Committee Trustees
- Hands on Dexterity Test

### **Suggestions For Preparation:**

- Algebra/general math courses
- Aptitude practice
- Dexterity practice
